Why Read The Bible?

How To Receive The Bible?

There are many ways we can practically go about positioning ourselves to receive the Bible. Here are a few that could be really helpful:

- Daily reading spend time each day reading a few verses or whole chapters at a time. Daily reading allows us to centre our day around hearing the voice of God in our lives and the eternal truths found in His Word.
- Listening to it read through apps or other means you can listen to it if you struggle to read. It's also helpful to hear someone else read it in a way we wouldn't have read ourselves.

- Devotional reading It is essential to study the Bible, but study tends to be cerebral and mental rather than worshipful. It is vital to read the Bible prayerfully, not merely intellectually. Several resources in the link above are helpful for this as well.
- Memorization Jesus memorized scripture and overcame the temptations of the devil through it. We also can memorize scripture for overcoming temptation, for our encouragement and comfort.
- The preaching of the Bible when we gather on Sundays, it is a great opportunity to receive scripture read for us but also explained and applied to our lives.
